3. Due to the ongoing validation of the new Personnel Administration System all Army data from 1 April 2007 are provisional and subject to review. "p" denotes provisional.
4. Figures have been rounded to 10; numbers ending in "5" have been rounded to the nearest multiple of 20 to prevent systematic bias. Totals and sub-totals have been rounded separately and so may not appear to be the sum of their parts. Actual figures are used in the calculation of percentages.
